For visa applications you will need to provide

- Passport valid for travel to the United States (valid for at least six months beyond your period of stay in the United States).
- Non-immigrant Visa Application, <u>Form DS-160</u> confirmation page
- Application fee payment receipt, if you are required to pay before your interview. (The cost for the B visa is usually around US\$160; there might also be an appointment fee (US\$ 2-20) and occasionally a reciprocity fee that must be paid at the time of visa issuance. All information is posted on the individual embassy's or consulate's website: http://www.usembassy.gov/)
- **Photo** You will upload your photo while completing the online Form DS-160. If the <u>photo upload</u> <u>fails</u>, you must bring one printed photo in the format explained in the <u>Photograph Requirements</u>.

In addition:

- Evidence must be provided regarding the purpose of the trip, intent to depart and arrangements made to cover costs of the trip.
- The applicant must establish that s/he has a residence outside the United States of America to which they intend to return.

Therefore the following additional documentation is suggested to be presented at the visa interview:

- Visa attestation letter from the Congress registration system which you can download from the registration system upon completion and payment of registration fees
- Return travel confirmation
- Hotel accommodation confirmation in Hawai'i
- Proof of employment in country of residence: i.e. employment contract or letter from employer
- Proof of financial connections to the home country (evidence of close family ties or social or cultural associations)
- Proof of housing in home country (e.g., rental contract)
